She sits on a number of boards. Amelia has played a key role supporting Akeyulerré's Angkwerre-lweme (Traditional Healing) Project over the past four years. In 2014 she was awarded Indigenous Person of the Year by the Alice Springs NAIDOC Week Committee for her tireless service to her community.

Amelia is one of the ACEM Winter Symposium plenary speakers for the Healing in the Centre session on Monday 26 July. Amelia will present *Angangkere – Traditional healing stories*.
